II. Change Names on Roster

Most of the names on the list in this section were the result of spelling errors on the entries on a muster roll. One of the men, Bixby, was listed by me with no first name. Steve Burk's research (see below) identified that first name. He also helped to identify the name Allen instead of Alden as the correct name.

III. Additional Names to be Added to Roster

The following list of names that were not on my original roster, except for 2 or 3 of the names from other research, are the result of research done by my colleague, Steve Burk, who found them in the multi-volume series titled *Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the Revolutionary War* (MS&S). Although this publication of names has been around since 1896, Steve is the first and only person to comb through the extensive listing for those soldiers who are on a muster roll indicating that they were on the expedition to Quebec. He then made up a list of all the men he found who were not on my original roster and forwarded it to me.

When I obtained the names and information from Steve, including the entry from the MS&S summary of the muster roll on which each name appears, I was very surprised at the total number. These were names that I had not included in my original roster done in 2010 and found in my book titled *Voices From a Wilderness Expedition: The Journals and Men of Benedict Arnold's Expedition to Quebec in 1775*. Initially I was dubious that all of his names that I had missed were accurate, but subsequent work with Steve's helped to verify that the following names should be added to my roster.

I am very grateful to Steve Burk for his excellent work in identifying the additional names. Without his work it is doubtful that any of these men would be known as members of the expedition to Quebec and their names would be lost to history. All of these men deserve the recognition of participating in what some have called the most difficult expedition of the Revolutionary War.

This number includes the men who returned with the dispirited and unsuccessful American Army that finally left Canada in May/June of 1776 and returned to Fort Ticonderoga.
